# PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT - WASTEWATER RECLAMATION FACILITY

**City of Billings receives \$90,000 energy efficiency incentive from NorthWestern Energy** for state-of-the art energy improvements at the Wastewater Reclamation Facility.

Over the past 3 years, the Public Works Department has upgraded the wastewater treatment process to produce even higher quality water that returns to the Yellowstone River. Part of this \$75M upgrade, included constructing a state-of-the-art aeration system that maximizes energy efficiency. Aeration is the most energy intensive process required in wastewater reclamation, accounting for approximately half of the electrical load used at the Wastewater Reclamation Facility (WRF).

## BILLINGS AWARDED \$11.6 MILLION IN BUILD FUNDS TO CONSTRUCT THE INNER BELT LOOP AND SKYLINE TRAIL!

The City of Billings was notified in September that the City would be receiving \$11.6 million in BUILD funds from the US Department of Transportation. The Better Utilizing Investments to Leverage Development, or BUILD, provides an opportunity for the US DOT to invest in road, rail, transit and port projects that achieve national transportation objectives. Previously known at TIGER Discretionary Grants, Congress has dedicated nearly \$7.9 billion to fund projects that have significant local or regional impact.

In 2020, \$1 billion in BUILD funds were available for a competitive grant process and the City of Billings applied for approximately \$16.8 million to complete the Inner Belt Loop, the Skyline Trail and the Stagecoach Trail. While the City was not successful in receiving the full request, DOT has awarded \$11.6 million to fully construct the Inner Belt Loop and Skyline Trail. This would not have been possible without the assistance of

our partners, Billings TrailNet, the Billings Chamber of Commerce, Big Sky Economic Development Agency, Yellowstone County, Montana Department of Transportation and especially Senator Tester, Senator Daines and Representative Gianforte.

With local funds of \$7 million from the City of Billings, and \$85,000 from Billings TrailNet, these projects will open alternative transportation routes that will enhance safety and travel time while also providing for economic development opportunities and outdoor recreation. The projects will:

- **ENHANCE** movement of goods, services and people;
- **CREATE** emergency rout for Billings Heights;
- **STRENGTHEN** multi-modal transportation infrastructure;
- **INCREASE** tourist and recreation economic activity;

- **REDUCE** congestion and community's carbon footprint;
- **PROVIDE** safe biking and walking options; and
- **ENHANCE** quality of life and livability of residents by increasing direct access to nature and outdoor active recreation leading to better public health.

This is a huge win for our community and we look forward to working with US DOT on the successful completion of this essential project.



# WHAT IF THERE'S NO ONE THERE TO ANSWER?



Yellowstone County. Big Sky Country. The Last Best Place. 2019 estimated the population over 161,000 and climbing. In your day to day lives you might not stop to think much about how county is running, how it is working 24/7/365. With a town this size there is always something happening. Disturbances, accidents, medical emergencies, and the list continues; Billings and its surrounding area is big.

There are a great many factors contributing to keeping our communities safe, a few of notable mention are the great Officers, Firefighters, EMS personnel, and 911 dispatchers. It is the last position we would like to spotlight this month. 911 calltakers and dispatchers work behind the scenes, gathering necessary information from callers, deploying responders to locations where help is needed, and providing direct/self-help information to those waiting for responders to arrive .

The dispatch center is currently employing 23 fully qualified people total, excluding the supervisors, to answer all the calls from the Community. Of the 31 budgeted positions, 25 are currently filled. Chronically low staffing levels throughout 2020 has placed the City-County 9-1-1 Center in the position of needing help from the Community, instead of the other way around. To give you an idea of what these dispatchers answered

in the 2019 year here are some of the numbers: 58,307 calls to 911, and 249,264 non-emergency calls, for a total of 307,571.

We need more applicants that are willing to answer your next call for help. Your next call to assist your loved one in a medical emergency, your next phone call reporting there is a fire spreading in the county, or reporting someone who is feeling suicidal. The 911 center answers all these calls for emergencies, but we also answer non-emergency calls.

This career holds so many benefits, great health insurance, extensive training, 3 paid vacations a year, overtime opportunities, and more. Another benefit is knowing that you yourself would be a key player in keeping our county safe. That you are helping your community with every call you pick up. If you have compassion, if you're a critical thinker, if you can type at least 40 words per minute, then you have what it takes to become a dispatcher for the City of Billings.

We need people now to spread the word. With these uncertain times no one wants to worry that their calls may go unanswered, that help was delayed because of staffing issues. infrastructure in the area. To overcome this lack of infrastructure, a prefabricated vault system was utilized, similar to what you would see at trailheads and campsites. As part of the construction, a new ADA accessible parking stall was created along with an ADA accessible route to the restroom and entrance to the dog park. This facility is a welcomed upgrade and a convenience to that will

be enjoyed by users at High Sierra Park for years to come.

## ROSE PARK PLAYGROUND

This summer, the Parks and Recreation Department held a voting contest as part of the selection process for the new playground equipment at Rose Park. Matching funds from the Land Water Conservation Fund grant will allow the Parks and Recreation Department to build a destination playground that is

sure to attract residents from across the city to enjoy. Billings' citizens were able to vote on two designs for each of the three playground pods. Over 700 votes were cast to determine Billings' favorite playground structures and the winning designs will be installed in the spring of 2021. The staff has ordered the equipment and it is anticipated to arrive at the end of December. The installation will occur as weather permits.



The fall and winter months at Billings Parks and Recreation transition from Summer Camps, Aquatics, and special interest activities, into a variety of Youth Sports. Flag Football, Girls and Boys Basketball, and Girls Volleyball become our main focus. Recreation is tasked with facilitating these sports and putting out a quality athletic option for the Billings area residents that is inexpensive and enjoyable for kids and parents alike. Finding the right coaches for these sports becomes a huge priority.

NFL Flag football is a safe way for 2nd- 5th grade boys and girls to learn the sport. Coaches like Tim Alkire, Dave Carey, and Dustin Sciacca have been volunteering their time and energy for years with Parks and Recreation. Each has created a culture of inclusion, education, and competitiveness at their home site, and all have done so in their own individual ways. All of our flag football coaches give hours of their time to teach the game and are greatly appreciated by the Recreation Department.

Girls and Boys Basketball is a great introduction to basketball for 4th-5th graders and a next step to instruction for 6th, 7th, and 8th graders. Kara Allen has seven years of experience in Parks and Rec Basketball coaching,

while Tara Sinkler, Georgia Meyer, and Amy Bender have multiple years of coaching as well. Each has developed their players with a focus on fundamentals and promoting a love for the game.

Girls Volleyball for 3rd – 5th graders, which will begin in February, keeps growing in popularity every year. Coaches like Abria Boze, Melanie Watkins, and Emme Nelson have created fun and energetic practice sessions that teach girls all of the basics they need to make volleyball an activity they will pursue well into the future. These 3 coach volleyball and basketball, while maintaining a full time student workload.

The Recreation Department finds it so important to not only offer these activities and others like: Tennis Is Elementary, Pickle ball, Fly-fishing , Backpacking, Cross Country Ski Trips, Piano Lessons, Kids in the Kitchen, and Baby Sitter Training, all with top level instruction from qualified Coaches.
