Community Crisis Center

Professional staff will provide these services as a licensed Montana Mental Health Center. Family Service

Family Service provides Billings residents access to nutritious food boxes containing protein, fresh fruits and vegetables, dairy, and more! They also distribute groceries through the Commodity Supplemental Food Program to all participating low-income seniors over the age of 60 years. Additionally, Family Services offers rent and utility assistance for those who find themselves with a three-day notice or utility shut off notice. Women Infants Children (WIC)

Special Supplemental Nutrition Program for women, infants, and children. Yellowstone Youth Services Center

The Acute Crisis Care Program provides a temporary home for youths in crisis situations who have no place to live and provides professional care to youths who have emotional and behavioral problems too severe to be managed in a traditional foster home. Behavioral and chemical dependency evaluations are offered. Outpatient services are available for self referral. Residential services can be accessed through licensed placing agencies. Tumbleweed Runaway Program

The Tumbleweed Runaway Program is a non-profit, community-based agency that provides services to runaway, homeless, and otherwise at-risk youth and their families. Tumbleweed's services are free of charge and include: crisis prevention; family counseling; adolescent support groups; information, advocacy, and referral to other community services; parenting courses; aftercare and assistance with locating runaway youth and reuniting them with their parent/legal guardians. • (406) 259-2558

Youth Homeless Demonstration Program (YHDP)

Our housing navigator coordinates with our youth and young adults, property managers and agencies that help facilitate independent housing to the population we serve (16-25). Case management is provided at least once a week and it addresses further issues from crisis intervention, food boxes, furniture, budgeting classes, life skill classes and basic understanding of community resources and rental knowledge. • (406) 259-2558
