#	Date	Reference Section	Question or Comment	City Response
1	1/18/24	General	Could a proposal be submitted under a subsidiary or does the parent organization have to submit it?	The proposal can be submitted by either party, but any ensuing contract should be between whichever company will be providing both the training <u>and</u> products.
2	1/18/24	Section 5: Scope	Are there any insurance requirements for this contract?	We are not requiring liability insurance, nor any other form of insurance, just the warranty requirements outlined within the RFP.
3	1/18/24	General	Is there a class size for the training on these night vision systems, such as 15, 20, or 30 students in the course?	There will likely be 31 participants in the training. Our Police Department range has two shootings ranges (same location) that can be run independently of each other. Range 1 is 100 yard range and Range 2 is a 60 yard range. Both of which are pistol and rifle authorized. How training is structured is up to you, so long as it meets the listed requirements.
4	1/18/24	Section 5: Scope	Do you require a POI (point of instruction) for the night vision training so you can see a full curriculum planned ahead of time on the RFP?	Yes, documentation of the training would be required to ensure training goals and objectives would be met, and to ensure training goals and objectives are consistent with industry best practices.
5	1/18/24	Section 5: Scope	The specs call for L-3 tubes. Are alternative models with similar specs allowed?	Due to the nature of the grant, equipment specifications, as written, must be proposed.
6	1/23/24	Section 5: Scope	Which brand is the department currently using or they would prefer?	We do not currently have a team-wide NVS, but do have PVS-14s. We received a grant for a team-wide NVS and it is specifically written for the DTNVS, which is why the specs are written as they are.
