 - Be mindful of the information you share in your posts, even with customized settings, to maintain your digital safety.
 - Consider creating lists or groups to make audience customization quicker and more efficient for future posts.

FACEBOOK AUDIENCE SETTINGS GUIDE



Before Posting:

- When creating a new post, look for the audience selector button, typically located below your name. It might display as "Public," "Friends," or another custom group.
- Click on the audience selector to see your options: Public, Friends, Friends except..., Specific friends, Only me, or Custom.
- Select the desired audience for your post. For more privacy, choose "Friends" or "Only me."

For Existing Posts:

- Go to the post you want to edit.
- Click on the three dots in the top right corner of the post and select "Edit audience."
- Choose your new audience from the options provided.

Setting Default Privacy:

- To set the default privacy setting for all your posts, navigate to Settings & Privacy > Settings > Privacy > Your Activity.
 - Click "Edit" next to "Who can see your future posts?" and select your preferred default audience.

Stories:

- Before sharing a story, tap the "Settings" gear icon on the top left.
- Go to "Privacy" > "Story."
- You can choose to hide your story from specific people or select "Close Friends" to share with a smaller group.

Posts:

- Instagram posts do not offer audience customization for each post; your profile is either public or private.
- To make your account private, go to Settings > Privacy > Account Privacy and toggle on "Private Account."

Comments and Tags:

- You can control who comments on your posts under Settings > Privacy > Comments.
- Manage who can tag you in posts and stories under Settings > Privacy > Tags.

TWITTER (X) AUDIENCE SETTINGS GUIDE



Protected Tweets:

- Twitter allows you to make your tweets visible only to your followers by protecting them.
- Go to Settings and Privacy > Privacy and safety > Audience and tagging > Protect your Tweets.
- Once enabled, only your followers will see your tweets, and new followers will need your approval.

Direct Messages (DMs):

- While you can't customize the audience for individual tweets (beyond the protected tweets setting), you can control who sends you direct messages.
- Go to Settings and Privacy > Privacy and safety > Direct Messages and adjust your preferences.

Tagging:

- Control who can tag you in photos under Settings and Privacy > Privacy and safety > Audience and tagging > Photo tagging.
