Did you know that our Police Department has a partnership with the public to identify suspects when a crime is being investigated?

Do you have a security or doorbell camera?

Here's how it works: Residents or businesses can sign up on the Police website. When a crime has been committed, officers know who in the vicinity of the crime might have video footage.

Police do not have access to your video unless you voluntarily provide it.

**Rimrock Corridor Safety Committee's mission statement:**

Given increasing traffic volume, tragic accidents and deaths, and growing concern from residents, the Rimrock Neighborhoods Task Force (RNTF) aims to improve pedestrian and traffic safety along Rimrock Road.

In advocating for greater pedestrian and traffic safety, the RNTF created the Rimrock Corridor Safety Committee to work with allies including residents, schools, churches, City Council and administration, School District 2, the Police Department, and other organizations that represent and/or serve people living along the Rimrock corridor.


Our initial focus will include working closely with the City on their master transportation plan to include greater safety measures along Rimrock Road. [Thank you to Jennifer Isern for helping us with our mission statement]

**Buckthorn Grant Update**

*The grant program to fund the removal of buckthorn throughout the city has begun. If you believe you have buckthorn on your property, please contact the Code Enforcement Clerk at 406-237-6146 to be added to the list.*

*A code enforcement officer will inspect the property, verify that it is buckthorn, and then the address will be forwarded to the removal contractor. Please do not contact the contractor directly.*

*The initial grant was for \$25,000; however, we will be applying for additional funds in January 2025.*

**Buckthorn is easier to identify in the winter months, so this will drive removal efforts. Removal will continue as long as there is grant funding.**



**Snow Removal**

*Winter is here, and we have had our first snowfall of the season. This is a reminder that sidewalks in front of or adjoining a property need to be cleared within 24 hours of the storm. We appreciate your assistance with keeping our city safe.*

# Alcohol misuse in Yellowstone County

Nearly 1 in 4 Yellowstone County residents reported excessively drinking in 2022.

Alcohol misuse has a negative impact on individuals, their families, friends and the community.

It includes binge drinking (4 or more drinks per occasion for women, 5 or more drinks per occasion for men), drinking alcohol while pregnant, and alcohol use under age 21.

Nationwide, excessive alcohol use costs \$249 billion each year in healthcare costs, lost productivity, criminal justice costs, and accidents.

One step to avoid excessive alcohol use is to know how much you are drinking by knowing standard drink sizes, and using tools like the “Alculator” to calculate how much alcohol is in your drink.

RNTF Board Position on possible change in funding for Safe Routes to School (SRTS) and Transportation Alternatives:

At the December 9, 2024 City Council meeting, Ward 4 Council Person Scott Aspenlieder brought up the possibility of shifting "Transportation Alternative funds" (primarily for adding trails) over to Safe Routes to School.

Your Rimrock Neighborhoods Task Force board supports this potential change in funding for these reasons:

- At this time, the City is not in a position to increase funding for parks maintenance. Since new trails would come under City budget after construction, ongoing maintenance of new trails can not be supported financially at the present time.
- Safe Routes to School needs a boost. There are many SRTS projects that haven't been built out. These projects are essential for the safety of children in our community. Further, it is our belief that more SRTS projects will be needed as the City grows.
- More children utilize sidewalks and crosswalks getting to and from school than use trails. Existing trails are still available for recreational use.
- Trail development can continue using private fundraising and grants for both construction and maintenance. Bringing future trails into our City park system can be reconsidered in the future should the economic situation for the City improve.

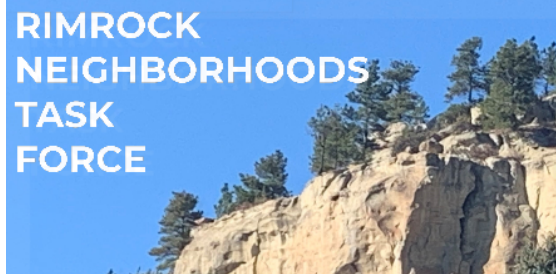
RNTF is not anti-trail. However, considering the current economic conditions, we support the prioritization of the safety of children over the expansion of recreational opportunities.
